**RUSSELL, ARTHUR SIDNEY**, Private, 2/4th (Territorial) Battn. The Queen's Own (Royal West Kent Regt.), s. of Arthur William Russell, Shopkeeper, by his wife, Marion, dau. of James Colven; b. Gravesend, co. Kent,

**Alexander Russell.**

16 Aug. 1895; educ. Higher Grade School there, and was afterwards employed as Laboratory Assistant at the Gravesend County Day School; joined the West Kent Territorials 25 Nov. 1914; served with the Mediterranean Expeditionary Force at Gallipoli from 18 July, 1915; took part in the landing at Suvla Bay in Aug.; was invalided to Malta suffering from an attack of dysentery; rejoined his battalion in Egypt, where he was in the Signalling Section of D Coy., and spent six weeks at the school for signalling instruction at Zeitoun, but was recalled to join his battalion at the end of March to go into action at Gaza on the 26th, and was killed in action there 19 April, 1917. Buried near Gaza. One of the signallers wrote: "I am sure that your son will be greatly missed by the whole battalion, especially by the signallers, among whom he was so popular. He was a good chap and willing to help anyone."
